1 General Competition Rules And Information

- The rules of golf apply at all times
- The competition sub-committee has the power to impose sanctions or penalties against any player / member who disregards the rules of golf or these competitions rules.
- In any dispute the committees' decision is final.
- Normal competition times:
 - Men: between 07.00 and 16.00 on Saturday or Sundays
 (dependent on time of year e.g. bad light etc)
 Primrose Bowl Competition:
 Between 09.00 and 17.00 during the week
 (dependent on time of year e.g. bad light etc.)
 - Ladies: between 12.00 and 14.00 on Sunday
 - Juniors: between 14.00 and 15.00 on Sunday
- Entry to Competitions will commence in the clubhouse at 19.00 on a Friday, one week prior to the competition. (With the exception of certain competitions e.g. Invitation day, Captains day or Presidents day when the entry sheets will be available on the Friday 2 weeks prior to the competition date). Primrose Bowl entry will be available up to 2 weeks prior to the competition date.
- It will be under the supervision of a member of committee until 19.30 and members may enter a maximum of two names (i.e. their own and one other), unless otherwise advised.
- Playing members of staff, members of the committee and past Captains may enter their own name prior to the Friday entry.
- If members have been away representing the club, county or country in official golfing events they may, at the discretion of the Captain, be allowed to join the competition on that day.
- No member is allowed to add his name to the competition start sheet after the draw has been made on Wednesday.
- A member can obtain a start time up to and including the day of the competition by adding his name to a 1 or 2 ball already on the start sheet by using the time vacant column on the apology sheet and entering his name via the PSI Touch Screen (or starting sheet when applicable).
- Primrose Bowl Competition – members can enter by selecting a vacant starting time on the PSI Touch Screen up to and including the date of the competition.
- Once a time has been taken on the apology sheet you are not allowed to change times.
- A start time cannot be changed after the draw has been made on Wednesday.

- Any member wishing to withdraw from the competition after the draw has been made, must use the apology sheet before 19.30 on the Friday prior to a Saturday competition and before 19.30 on Saturday prior to a Sunday competition. Failure to comply will result in suspension from the next singles competition.
- Any member failing to make his starting time on the tee will receive an automatic suspension from the next singles competition.
- Regular offenders of the competition rules, in the competition committee's opinion may be subject to further penalties.
- Members playing in a competition when serving a ban will incur a further ban of another singles competition suspension and are disqualified from the competition
- The apology sheet is for the use of competitors only.
- All competitions are subject to change as circumstances may warrant.
- Any competitor who fails to sign in via the PSI Touch Screen (or starting sheet when applicable) before starting play will be disqualified. His card will not be entered into the competition and will be deemed neither a score for the competition or for handicapping purposes, nor will he be eligible for the twos competition.
- Any competitor whose entry fee is not paid before starting will be disqualified. His card will not be entered into the competition and will be deemed neither a score for the competition or for handicapping purposes, nor will he be eligible for the twos competition.
- All cards must have the current handicap appended (either exact or playing) and signed by the competitor and the marker. Failure to comply with the above will result in disqualification.
- All cards must be returned in competitions (including NRs) and entered into the computer in the lounge. Anyone who has a "no return" on a hole should continue to enter his scores on the following holes. Each competitor is responsible for his own card.
- Any player who fails to return his scorecard in a competition and / or fails to enter the score in the computer on more than one occasion, will be asked to appear before the competitions sub-committee when sanctions may be applied.
- Scores on scorecards must be legible and any cards that are re-written must have the original attached.
- All players are requested to circle twos on their scorecards
- With the exception of shotgun competitions competitors must start at the 1st tee in all competitions.
- All singles competitors should go out in 3's where possible.
- Only one junior player is allowed to play in each three ball.
- In 4 ball or foursomes/greensomes competitions, a full or senior member must partner juniors.

- Starting times will not be changed by competitors or delayed due to inclement weather
- The competition committee may abandon or suspend a competition if weather conditions deem it necessary.
- Players cannot enter the sweep or twos without entering the competition and paying the entry fee.
- Competitors after playing out the 1st hole and before driving off on the 2nd hole must allow competitors behind to play their approach shots to the 1st green.
- The 18th hole is a “call on hole”. Players when on the green are requested to mark their ball, stand back and call on the players behind, they then play out the hole while the players behind walk to the green.
- Major board competition play-offs are played within 28 days of the original date of the competition. The date will be decided by the players involved and the date of the play-off will be posted on the competition notice board and the board in the club house. If the play-off tie finishes in a tie, then the tied competitors shall play a further 18 holes at an arranged date. If the play off is not played within the 28 day timescale the competitions convenor will choose a new date and players must play the play off on this date.
- Calcutta Cup, R H Jopling and D Moralee Cup matchplay Competitions. If after 18 holes, during the knockout matches, the match is tied, a further three holes starting at hole 1 will be played on the basis that the winner is declared the one who wins the best of three holes. If after holes 1, 2 and 3, the match is still tied, a further three holes will be played starting at hole no4 and continue in numerical order as a best of three holes until a winner can be declared.
- Resolution of ties in minor competitions will be decided by back 9, back 6, back 3, back 1. If a tie still occurs then the count back is taken over the front 9, front 6, front 3, front 1, until a result is established. Failing this, a further 18 holes will be played by the tied players to decide the result.
- In the event of lightning or adverse weather conditions making the course unplayable, a claxon will be sounded with one prolonged distinct blast. Players must mark their ball and leave the course. Play will be resumed once the danger has passed or conditions improve and the claxon will be sounded with two short distinct blasts to restart play. It may be necessary to abandon the competition, this will be decided by the committee taking into account the weather forecast, the remaining period of light, the numbers of players completed and the state of the course, this will be signified with three distinctive blasts.
- All players who enter a 36-hole competition are required to play both rounds and any player who fails to play in both rounds will be suspended from the next singles competition (club championship – see specific rules).
- When a competition in progress is cancelled all monies will be refunded. A record of all fee paying players in cancelled competitions will be kept.

- If a Calcutta or R H Jopling match has to be abandoned due to adverse weather, play will continue on the tee of the hole in play at the time of the abandonment and with the score at that time, when the match is rearranged
- Any player in qualifying competitions away from Heworth golf club will be responsible for informing the competitions convenor of any score that will affect his handicap. Away scores should be returned within 7 days for chronological handicapping record maintenance. Failure to do so could lead to a suspension of his handicap.
- The use of buggies is allowed in competitions except when the competition format is stated as a “walking competition”.
- Only those members who have shared ownership of one buggy will be allowed, if requested, to play together in a Men’s competition if drawn in the same zone.
- Entry to Captains Day, Presidents Day, Invitation Day and Heworth Open will be restricted to members who have submitted a minimum of three medal and / or stableford cards before the specified event.
- Only bone fide members of golf clubs with official active handicaps can enter the club open competitions.
- The Competitions Sub-Committee will make final decisions on all matters related to the Competition Rules as shown in this document.

2. INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS

- B A Stronge Cup** **Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less may enter this competition, but must play with an adult.
- Byers Cups** **Major Pairs Competition (Net)**
Non-qualifying 18 holes 4 bbb par / bogey competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28 then 90% of individual handicap allowances. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less may enter this competition but must partner an adult.
- Calcutta Cup** **Major Singles Competition (matchplay Net) Qualifying Competition.**
Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition will be held and the top 63 + 1 (last years' winner) will be entered into a general numerical draw. No Juniors
- Matchplay Competition.**
Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. The knockout matches between opponents will be played using the full differential of handicaps. The cut-off dates for the completion of each round will be posted on the competition draw sheet. Any player having difficulties organising their match, should contact a member of the competitions sub-committee. In the event of the match not being completed by the cut-off date, the result of the match will be decided by the sub-committee. The competition committee and finalists will agree a date of the final. No juniors.
- Calix Majorum** **Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Entrants must be 50 years or over on the day of the competition. Entrants must indicate over 50 on the card.
- Captains Trophy** **Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors at the discretion of the Captain.
- JD Corbett Salver** **Major Double Competition (Net)**
Non-qualifying 18-hole 4 BBB Stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28 then 90% of individual handicap allowances. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.
- Centenary Cup** **Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less may enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Coronation Cup**Major Singles Competition (Net)**

Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play bogey competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less may enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Club Championship**Major Singles Competition (Gross)**

Qualifying 36-hole stroke-play competition on lowest gross score basis held over two consecutive days.

Day (1) will be round 1 of the club championship and will be operated as a qualifying round for Day (2).

Round (1) of the competition will be played on a Saturday from 8.30 to 11.30. Ladies 12.00 to 13.00. Round (1) continues 13.00 to 14.30. The tee will be closed from 8.00 until 14.45.

Day (2) will be round 2 of the Club Championship.

Round 2 of the Club Championship (Sunday) will be contested by those players forming a cut of the top forty two & ties of round (1) of the competition. Play on day 2, will be seeded according to gross score (lowest gross score out last). Round (2) will be played 9.00 to 11.00 with the tee closed from 8-30 until 11.30.

Players not in the club championship will play off the yellow tees outside the times required for the Club Championship on the Saturday & Sunday. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Any qualifier not turning up for day (2) will be banned for the next singles competitions.

In the event of a tie after 36 holes a further five holes 1, 2, 3, 17 & 18 will be played to determine the Club champion. In the event that scores are still tied after additional five holes, sudden death will be played on holes 1, 2, 3, 17 & 18 until a winner is declared.

Prize money for this event will be as recorded in section 4 of these rules. The fund for 2s will be split 60% for day 1 and 40% for day 2.

David Moralee Cup**Major Singles K.O. Competition (Scratch Matchplay)**

The knock-out matches between opponents will be played off scratch handicaps. The cut-off dates for the completion of each round will be posted on the competition draw sheet. If any match is not completed by the cut-off date, then both competitors will be disqualified. Given dates for the completion of the rounds to be strictly adhered to. The date for the final will be agreed between the competition committee and finalists immediately after the end date for the semi-finals. If there are not equal multiples of 16 players entered, an open draw will be made to determine byes. The first names drawn are the byes with sufficient preliminary games to complete the competition to 16,

32 or 64 players. All golfers are eligible and juniors will be allowed to play in the scratch knock-out.

Fenwick Green Cup Major Singles Competition (Net)
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Field Day Minor Singles and Category Competition (Net)
Qualifying 18-hole Stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. There will be 7 qualifying rounds throughout the season held alongside a Major Stroke-play competition of which there will be an additional entry fee. During each qualifying competition, 24 players will qualify - 6 from each category (Cat1, Cat2, Cat3, Cat4) Should there not be 6 qualifiers from a category, additional qualifiers will be taken from the remaining category's based on the best Net scores. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.
Field Day Final - The winner of the Field Day will be decided on best Net score overall. Sweep stake monies go to the winners of the competition not the winners of the qualifying competition. Any member who has not qualified for the Field Day Final will be allowed to play on the day but can only enter the Twos competition and will not be eligible for any other prizes and his score will be used for handicap purposes.

Four man Team Invitational Minor Team Competition (Net)
Non-qualifying 18-hole stableford competition. Best three scores from 4 count at each hole. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28 then 90% of individual handicap allowances with a maximum of 18 strokes allowed. Team must consist of at least one Heworth Golf Club member. Members of other clubs allowed but must have a current competition handicap

George Govan Trophy Minor Texas Scramble Competition (Net)
Non-qualifying 18-hole Stroke-play competition. Four man team Texas Scramble competition, handicaps (full allowance to a maximum of 28) to be added together and then divided by 10 to give team allowance. Each player to take a minimum of four drives and these to be shown on the scorecard in the Markers column. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less may enter the competition but must play with an adult.

Hannay Cup Major Singles Competition (Net)
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play stableford competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

- Innes Hopkins Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.
- Invitation Day Minor Pairs Competition (Net)**
Non-qualifying 18-hole stroke-play 4 bbb stableford competition Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28 then 90% of individual handicap allowances. Invited guests must be members of a bona fide golf club and winners will be asked to produce an active handicap certificate. No juniors.
- Jack Stevenson Cup Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play stableford competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.
- Jarrow & Hebburn Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 36-hole stroke-play aggregate competition over two consecutive days. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28, the same handicap allowance applies in rounds (1) & (2). Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.
- John Devine Trophy Minor Singles Competition (Gross)**
Presented to the player with the lowest gross score over the prevailing season in a men's qualifying stroke play club competition played off 18 white tees and 18 permanent/proper greens. Preferred lies must not be in play. In the event of more than one player recording the same score, the trophy will be awarded to the player having the lowest score using current CONGU count back rules
- J P Burns Cup Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 36-hole stroke-play aggregate competition over two consecutive days. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28, the same handicap allowance applies in rounds (1) & (2). Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.
- Jubilee Cup Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.
- Keith Shivers Memorial Trophy Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult. The qualifier for this competition is the Jack Stephenson Cup of which there will be an additional entry fee. 90 players can qualify. Should there be ties in 90th position, count-back will be used to determine qualification. This competition will be played along-side the Keith Shivers Bowl.

Millennium Trophy **Major Pairs Competition (Net)**
Shotgun start. Non-qualifying 18 hole greensomes stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28 and an allowance of 0.6 of the low handicap player plus 0.4 of the higher handicap player. Decimal point strokes count. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Moses Trophy **Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play stableford competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Presidents Salver **Major Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors at the discretion of the president.

Primrose Bowl **Minor Singles Competition (Net)**
One round played each month over a six month period with the best three scores counting (aggregate). Qualifying 18-hole stableford competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less may enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Pudsey Bear **Minor Singles Competition (Net)**
Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play stableford competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

R H Jopling Trophies **Major Doubles Competition (Matchplay Net) Qualifying Competition.**
Non-qualifying 18 hole 4 bbb stroke-play competition. Top 31 pairs + 1 pair (last year's winners) qualify to play in match play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28 then 90% of individual handicap allowances. No juniors.

Matchplay Competition.
Non-qualifying 18-hole pairs matchplay competition. The top 31 pairs from the qualifying competition, together with the previous years' winners, will be entered into a general numerical draw. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. The knock out matches between the pairs will be played using 90% of individual handicap differential taken from the lowest handicap player. The cut-off dates for the completion of each round will be posted on the competition draw sheet. Any player having difficulties organising their match, should contact a member of the competitions sub-committee. In the event of the match not being completed by the cut-off date, the result of the match will be decided by the sub-committee. All rounds to be played off

current handicap and 90% difference. Time and date of the final to be arranged by the competition committee and finalists. No juniors. Sweep stake monies go to the winners of the competition not the winners of the qualifying competition.

Scott Charlton Bowl Major Singles Competition (Net)

Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 12 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Secretary's Cup

Major Singles Competition (Net)

Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less may enter this competition, but must play with an adult.

Spes Ultima

Major Singles Competition (Net)

Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

Walters Trophies

Major Pairs Competition (Net)

Non-qualifying 18-hole foursomes stroke-play competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28 and an allowance of 1/2 the combined handicaps (1/2 strokes count). Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must partner an adult.

Usher Cup

Minor Singles Competition (Net)

Qualifying 18-hole stroke-play stableford competition. Full handicap allowance to a maximum of 28. Juniors with a handicap of 18 or less can enter this competition but must play with an adult.

3. HANDICAPS

- Members who do not play in at least three singles medal or stableford rounds during a season will be deemed to have an inactive handicap for competition purposes.
- Any breach of handicap rules can result in:
 - loss of handicap.
 - disqualification.
 - exclusion from competitions.
 - suspension of their handicap.
- All new members must have an official club handicap to play in competitions.
- New handicaps are obtained as follows:-
 - Where a new member has been a member of a golf club a handicap certificate from their previous club or their unique EGU ID number, must be shown.
 - New members need to produce three cards by playing 3 rounds of golf.
 - A member (marker) with an active current handicap must sign all cards.
 - The marker must print his name as well as signing the card.
 - The 3 cards required for obtaining a handicap must be completed in all details and marked “for handicap purposes”, placed in an envelope and either handed to the competition’s convenor or club administrator or posted in the box provided in the locker room..
 - The allocated new handicap certificate will be deposited in the alphabetic handicap file box located in the locker room.
- Members who choose another club as their home club must ensure they inform the club of any changes to their playing handicap before they play in club competitions.
- All qualifying scores in away competitions must be reported to the home club within 7 days and cards and returns supplied to ensure handicaps are current.
- Members returning scores below SSS in away competitions must adjust their own handicaps when necessary if a member of the competition committee is not available.
- General play adjustments will be applied as and when required under CONGU rules. The competition committee’s decision is final.
- Handicap certificates for away competitions should be requested in good time, which will be provided by the competition committee or administrator.

4. PRIZES and SWEEPS

- All trophies will be presented on presentation night and all winners are expected to attend.
- Prizes and sweepstakes should be collected from the Professionals' shop within 8 weeks after the results are declared or the prizes and sweepstakes will be entered into the professionals' book.
- All players must pay the competition entry fee and sign in via the PSI Touch Screen (or start sheet when applicable) prior to playing.
- Unless otherwise advised, members who intend to enter Men's Competitions as listed in the Fixtures need to ensure their 'swipe card' is useable with the PSI Touch Screens both in the Bar Area and Professionals shop. The card will be used initially to ENTER competitions via a start sheet from a Friday evening and to SIGN IN to a competition on the respective day, and to ENTER YOUR SCORE at the end of the round (s).
- Juniors are not allowed to enter the competition sweep; they may enter the 2s competition.
- In all competitions, 2s should be circled to assist competitions committee; no other scores should be circled on the scorecard.
- A hole in one prize is included in all competitions entry money for which a hole in one tie will be awarded.
- Prizes for Net competitions will be allocated as follows:
 - 1st Net trophy and 1st sweep
 - 2nd Net £15.00 voucher and 2nd sweep
 - 3rd Net £10.00 voucher and 3rd sweep
 - Best gross £10.00 voucher
 - Note: Primrose Bowl – vouchers will only be supplied to the top 4 finishers after the final qualifying event showing final results and will be allocated as follows:
 - 1st Net £20.00 voucher
 - 2nd Net £15.00 voucher
 - 3rd Net £10.00 voucher
 - 4th Net £10.00 voucher

Note: Field Day Prizes will be advised during the 2016 season

- Prizes for Gross competitions will be allocated as follows:
 - 1st gross trophy and 1st sweep
 - 2nd gross £15.00 voucher and 2nd sweep
 - 3rd gross £10.00 voucher and 3rd sweep
 - Best Net prize £10.00 voucher
- Sweepstakes are divided as follows:
 - Winner 50%

- Second 30%
- Third 20%

- Players may not win more than one prize in any competition, i.e. best net and best gross
- Two's sweep is paid even when a player has "no returned" and been disqualified from the competition provided the scorecard is correctly signed. The Two's sweep will be entered in a book located in the Professionals' shop and the sweep can only be spent via the Professionals.
- Any visitor winning prizes in any Open day or Invitation day competitions must produce a bona fide active current handicap certificate if requested.

Entry fees are as follows,

Singles competitions

- Competition entry £1.50 per person
- Twos competition £1.50 per person
- Sweep £0.50 per person

Pairs competitions

- Competition entry £3.00 per pair
- Twos competition £3.00 per pair
- Sweep £1.00 per pair

36 Hole competitions

- Competition entry £1.50 per person
- Twos competition £3.00 per person
- Sweep £1.00 per person

- Qualifying competitions e.g. Calcutta & R H Jopling
 - In these competitions an extra 50p per player will be added to the competition fee for a sweep to be paid out to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions on the qualifying day. The main sweep monies will be paid out when the results of these competitions are known.
- Club championship (day 1)
 - Competition entry £1.50 per person
 - Twos competition £1.50 per person
 - Sweep £0.50 per person
 - Total £3.50
- Club championship (day 2)
 - Twos competition £1.50 per person
 - Sweep £0.50 per person
 - Total £2.00
- Captain's day, Presidents day, Invitation day and Open competitions fees are subject to variation, which is decided by the committee prior to the competition.

5. Penalties for non-compliance with rules

Singles competitions.

Failure to turn-up on tee: - banned for next singles competition.

Failure to arrive within 5 minutes of allotted starting time incurs a 2 stroke penalty in stroke play and loss of hole in matchplay. Arriving later than 5 minutes from allotted starting time results in disqualification.

Members playing in a competition whilst serving a ban will incur a further suspension of one competition.

Doubles competitions.

In doubles competitions there is no apologies sheet.

In a doubles competition if a player does not show on the tee & does not provide a substitute player for his partner then he will be banned from the next singles competition

If both players fail to show on the tee & fail to provide substitutes then both will be banned from the next singles & the next pairs' competitions.

Eligible players missing the second day of a 2-day competition will be banned from the next singles competition.

6 Miscellaneous

May 2008, Resolved. Men team players will be allowed to practice from white tees (Fridays excluded)
